Discussion

What is the most expensive item you own?

What is the most expensive item you would like to own?

Would you freely give it away like the woman in the Bible passage today who washed Jesus' feet with expensive perfume?

Why do you think she used the perfume in that way?

Craft:

Family Faith Questions:

Discuss these topics as you do your crafts together.

Is it easier to give help or receive it?

Clay Pots

You will need: air drying clay, pencils, cocktail sticks or sculpting tools, paper plates, water for dipping fingers into and for smoothing the clay, protection for surfaces.

Give each child a paper plate and ask them to write their name on their plate. Give them some clay each and ask them to make a pot or jar from the clay. When jars and pots are complete they should place them on the plates to dry.

Talk about the jar of precious perfume being like an extravagant gift of love for Jesus. Discuss how they show love. Talk about how we can show Jesus' love to others today.

Next week we will focus on Jesus and the disciple's and their experience of God's affirmation of Jesus.
