# March 31/April 4th - Blindness - Luke 18.31-19.10

### Game/Activity:

### Studying The Details

You will need: a variety of small objects or very intricate detailed pictures, a magnifying glass.

Allow the children to look very closely at each object through the magnifying glass and see the detail of the object or use the magnifying glass to look closely at the detailed picture to see if they can spot something which they at first did not see in it when looking with just their eyes.

Talk about how sometimes we miss seeing things because they are small but when we look carefully we see so much more and use this as a way into talking of Zacchaeus.

## Change Is Possible

You will need: a large print of one of the slips available on page 142, plus slips for each child saying CHANGE.

Discuss the statement with the young people. Ask them what is change? What could your new goal be for every day/week/month? Zacchaeus changed in today's Bible story. How much did he change and how did he change?

C H A N G E = Christ Has A New Goal Everyday

#### Craft:

### Changes

You will need: a selection of sheets of paper (each with a small shape drawn on it somewhere such as a small circle, square, rectangle or triangle, a small window or door and similar), pencils, colored pencils, felt-tip pens.

Give each child one of the sheets and simply challenge them to make a bigger picture starting with the small shape. For example, a small circle could become a car using the circle as a wheel, or a small window becomes a house and so on. Once drawn let the children color in their creation and discuss how the change has taken place.

Talk about the story and the how Jesus noticed Zacchaeus even though he was up in the tree. Talk about the change to Zacchaeus once he had met Jesus. Ask the children to think about how they, even though they are small, can bring change to those around them.

#### Next Week:

Next week we will focus on the story of Jesus and the Palm Sunday Parade.

### Sending Prayer:

Ask the kids if there are any prayers they'd like to focus on. Pray together.
